MESSAGE FROM PASTOR SHERREL

Dear Oak Grove Family,

I greet you all in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ and hope you're doing well. I want to begin by encouraging everyone to please continue to pray for the people of Turkey and Syria who were impacted by the terrible earthquakes. As you probably know, we support the ministry of Kaya Essen, who serves as a missionary in a region near the epicenter of the quakes. We have already sent a financial gift to Brother Kaya to help with some of the pressing immediate needs. In addition, he recently informed us of a very special need regarding at least 35 orphaned children whom he helps. They are in urgent need of housing for these children. Kaya needs to raise \$25,000 in order to obtain a building that can accommodate the kids. It is a costly endeavor but there are a number of other churches involved and I am prayerfully asking you to give what you can over the next few weeks. We will distribute special offering envelops throughout the sanctuary as well as the front and ramp door entrances. Thank you in advance for your gracious giving.

A few weeks ago I began preaching a series of messages on revival from the Book Of Jonah. I felt led to use this sermon series to help us kick start a time of revitalization for our church. This revitalization process will involve looking at the current state of our fellowship. A church survey is already circulating throughout the congregation and townhall meetings are taking place. The purpose of these meetings is to share information and ideas with one another about how we can improve church ministries and stimulate growth in the present and the future. The second meeting will take place on **Sunday night, March 5th at 6 pm**.

We are all burdened about the future of Oak Grove, and we all want to see growth, especially in the area of children and youth. I believe that this can happen. Nothing is impossible with God. So, let's work diligently and pray fervently and ask God to send a time of refreshing and a great harvest to us here at "The Grove"! I love you all and I'll see you in church or online!

I am pleased about the ongoing efforts of our staff and church council in the revialazation of OGBC. I know the last 3 years have proven to be detrimental for church growth in most churches. Not just Covid causes for loss of attendance, but many members have passed and others are homebound or in nursing homes.

Just like many churches, we are an older congregation of members. It is evident our priority should be set on reaching younger couples and therefore, reaching children. I am totally aware the task at hand will not be easy. Some churches are seeing growth in different areas whether it be Sunday School, the worship hour, children's programs, or music ministry. I think most important might be some structured church wide visitation promotion.
